The Historic Sites Preservation Commission is a branch of the County government that works to nominate, protect, and preserve historic sites within the County. The Commission deals mainly with properties outside the County's cities and villages, but inside the townships.

A historic site can be a building, structure or archaeological site. It is usually more than 50 years old and considered to be important either by who designed/built it, who lived there, what is was used for or what it can tell us about the past. The Commission usually meets on a monthly basis to discuss pertinent topics regarding historic properties and archaeological sites in the County.
